Becoming a victim of burglary may put your home at an increased risk of future burglaries. To help prevent this, please follow the advice below, as provided by the initial investigating
 officer. You will receive a further visit from your local police team in the next few days. In this follow up visit, officers can once again discuss your home security with you and answer any questions you may have.
